Description

A charming mid-century studio pottery bowl from the Ditchling tradition, dating to circa 1960 and painted with a lively vine design. The bowl has a warm, handmade presence, its simple functional form providing an attractive ground for the freely drawn decoration.

The interior is enriched with curling vines and foliage, painted with an unforced, rhythmic quality that reflects the enduring Arts and Crafts influence associated with Ditchling pottery. The restrained palette and expressive brushwork lend the piece both decorative appeal and an unmistakably individual character.

The bowl is initialled `NB`; although the maker has not been identified, the mark provides an intriguing point of reference and adds to its studio character. Its combination of practical form, hand-painted ornament, and quietly distinctive finish makes it a pleasing example of British post-war studio pottery.

Ideal for display on a dresser, open shelving, or a ceramic collection, it would also serve beautifully as a small serving or fruit bowl. A thoughtful addition for collectors of Ditchling pottery, British studio ceramics, and mid-century decorative arts.
