Description

A large and impressive anatomical teaching chart illustrating the human skeleton in both anterior and posterior views. Drawn by American Frohse Anatomical Charts and published by A. J. Nystrom of Chicago, it was retailed in the United Kingdom by Adam, Rouilly & Co. of London.

Rendered with remarkable clarity and precision, the chart presents the complete skeletal structure from the front and back, allowing the viewer to study the relationship between the skull, spine, rib cage, pelvis, limbs, and smaller bones of the hands and feet. The paired views make this an especially effective educational image, offering a comprehensive understanding of the body's underlying framework.

Originally intended for use in a classroom, medical setting, or training environment, it carries the distinctive visual authority of traditional anatomical teaching material. Its large scale, detailed draughtsmanship, and period publishing history make it both an informative scientific object and a striking piece of wall decoration.

Today, the chart would make a compelling focal point in a study, library, studio, medical practice, or interior with an interest in science, education, and design. It is equally appealing to collectors of medical ephemera, early educational material, and graphic anatomical art.
