Indian papier-mâché is a traditional craft that blends creativity, sustainability, and intricate artistry. Originating in Kashmir, it was introduced in the 14th century and has since become a symbol of cultural heritage.

Artisans create objects by moulding paper pulp into forms, which are then dried, polished, and hand-painted with elaborate designs. Bright colours, gold leaf, and motifs inspired by nature-such as flowers, birds, and chinar leaves-define the style. Common products include decorative bowls, boxes, trays, ornaments, and vases.
