Description

A handsome and finely cut glass water jug dating from around 1900, combining practical utility with the decorative brilliance so characteristic of turn-of-the-century table glass. Elegantly proportioned, the jug is richly worked with faceted and geometric cutting that catches and refracts the light, giving the surface a lively, sparkling appearance.

The substantial glass body is designed for serving water, cordials, or iced drinks, while its cut decoration lends a sense of occasion to the table. Whether used as part of a formal dining setting or displayed in a cabinet, the piece has the timeless appeal of quality antique glassware: solid, tactile, and beautifully responsive to light.

Dating from the late Victorian to Edwardian period, this jug reflects an era in which even functional household objects were made with considerable care and decorative ambition. The precision of the cutting and the weight of the glass give it a pleasing presence, while its classic form allows it to sit comfortably in both traditional and contemporary interiors.

A versatile and attractive addition to a collection of antique glass, a period dining table, or a barware display. It would also make a thoughtful gift for anyone with an appreciation for early 20th-century craftsmanship.
