Egyptian Revival jewellery emerged in the 19th century and gained major popularity after archaeological discoveries such as the excavation of Tutankhamun's tomb in 1922.

Designers drew inspiration from ancient Egyptian motifs, incorporating symbols like scarabs, lotuses, sphinxes, and the Eye of Horus. Vibrant colours - turquoise, lapis lazuli, carnelian, and enamel - evoked the rich palettes of antiquity. Gold-tone metals and geometric patterns mirrored ancient craftsmanship while fitting modern tastes.

The style blended mystique, history, and glamour, appealing to those fascinated by Egypt's cultural heritage.

Today, Egyptian Revival pieces remain highly collectible, celebrated for their bold aesthetics and enduring sense of timeless wonder.
