

Art Deco Diamond Bow Brooch, Circa 1930

Description

A graceful and beautifully articulated Art Deco diamond bow brooch, dating to circa 1930. Designed as a softly tied ribbon, the brooch is pavé-set throughout with old-cut diamonds, whose individually faceted brilliance gives the jewel a gentle, lively sparkle.

The bow motif was a perennial favourite in fine jewellery, symbolising love, connection, and celebration. Here it is interpreted with the crisp symmetry and refined geometry of the Art Deco period: the loops are neatly balanced, the ribbon tails elegantly arranged, and the diamond setting creates a continuous field of light across the design.

The use of old-cut diamonds brings a particularly pleasing character to the piece. Rather than the sharp, uniform flash of modern stones, their hand-cut facets produce a warmer, more nuanced scintillation, lending softness and depth to the stylised form. The result is a jewel that is both distinctly of its period and effortlessly wearable today.

A versatile and sophisticated example of 1930s diamond jewellery, this brooch would sit beautifully on a lapel, evening coat, silk blouse, or dress. It is an appealing addition to a collection of Art Deco jewellery and an elegant choice for anyone drawn to the enduring romance of diamond-set bows.
