Bokhara rugs, renowned for their intricate beauty, originate from the city of Bokhara (now Bukhara, Uzbekistan), though they're primarily associated with the Tekke tribe of Turkmenistan. These hand-woven rugs feature distinctive, repeated octagonal motifs called "guls," typically in rich red, brown, or rust hues.

Made from high-quality wool, Bokhara rugs are prized for their softness, craftsmanship, and unique geometric patterns. They blend traditional designs with modern interiors, symbolising cultural heritage and artistic excellence in rug making.
