

Victorian Paste-Stone Brooch, Circa 1880

Description

A graceful late Victorian yellow-metal brooch, dating to circa 1880 and centred with a bright paste stone. Elegant in its simplicity, the piece reflects the Victorian taste for jewellery that combined warm gold-coloured metalwork with the lively sparkle of hand-cut imitation gemstones.

The central paste stone has been chosen for its light-catching brilliance, lending the brooch a refined decorative presence. During the 19th century, high-quality paste was valued not merely as an affordable substitute for precious stones, but as a material in its own right: carefully cut and foiled examples could produce an especially vivid, candlelit shimmer.

The brooch's classic form makes it an appealing and versatile example of Victorian jewellery. It can be worn at the collar, lapel, or neckline, or displayed as part of a collection of antique jewellery and accessories. Its understated design allows the warmth of the yellow metal and sparkle of the central stone to take centre stage.

A charming piece of late 19th-century jewellery, offering period character, gentle elegance, and an attractive connection to Victorian dress and adornment.
