Popular in the 18th and 19th centuries, bright cutting enhances the elegance of silver items like spoons, trays, and jewellery. The craftsmanship emphasises intricate floral motifs, geometric designs, or personalised monograms, adding a touch of sophistication and timeless beauty to the pieces.
