Description

Worked in brightly coloured wools with a floral design principally of tulips, within a pure wool covered mount, museum glazed, framed, dimensions include frame

Turkeywork is made by knotting and trimming woollen threads through a woven canvas, to create a carpettype material with a pile. The technique was developed in England during the 16th century, for furnishing, in imitation of imported rugs from Spain, Turkey and the Middle East
