Description

Three-piece, Art Deco style, silver-plated tea service on its original tray and made by the noted French producer of silver and silver-plated tableware, Christofle. The circular pieces have stepped borders in the Art Deco manner and fitted with wooden handles and finials.

Height given is for the teapot. Milk jug 4¼" tall (110mm) Sugar 2¾" tall (70mm) Tray 19¾" x 15" (500mm x 380mm)

Art Deco, short for the French Arts Décoratifs, and sometimes referred to simply as Deco, is a style of visual arts, architecture, and product design, that first appeared in France in the 1910s and flourished in the United States and Europe during the 1920s to early 1930s.

Art Deco combined modern styles with fine craftsmanship and rich materials, and during its heyday it represented luxury, glamour, exuberance, and faith in social and technological progress.
