Description

Excellent set of hand-forged Victorian sterling silver cutlery in the Wellington pattern and mostly made by one of the 19th century's best silver cutlery makers, George Adams.

Wellington is a mid-19th-century pattern named after the Great Duke of Wellington. Two variations are known: with a double thread down the length of the stem ending at the bowl with scrolls, like this set, or with a plain lower half of the stem.

This excellent antique cutlery set comprises:

- 12 table forks
- 12 table soup spoons
- 12 teaspoons
- 12 dessert forks (6 x Goldsmiths & Silversmiths Co, 1996)
- 12 dessert spoons
- 6 egg spoons
- 1 basting spoon
- 1 soup ladle
- 2 sauce ladles
- 1 sugar sifter
- 1 marrow scoop

Also included in the set are cutlery pieces made by Goldsmiths & Silversmiths Company, London 1995 & 1996:

- 12 fish forks
- 12 fish knives (silver blades)
- 12 table knives (stainless steel blades)
- 12 dessert knives (stainless steel blades)
